Who:

Girl Scouts of Connecticut (GSOFC) is the recognized girl empowerment organization dedicated to lifelong success through values-based leadership development and personal growth. In partnership with committed adults, girls in grades K-12 develop strong values, social conscience, and conviction about their own potential and self-worth. Our mission is to build girls of courage, confidence, and character, who make the world a better place.

The first Girl Scout Troop in Connecticut was formed in 1912. By 1920 a large number of groups of Girl Scouts began organizing and Girl Scout councils formed to provide support for Girl Scouting in CT. In 2007 the five Girl Scout councils in CT merged to become one, vibrant organization, making Girl Scouts of Connecticut the largest organization serving women and girls in Connecticut.

What:







GSOFC provides informational programs and activities that help girls develop their leadership and citizenship skills in a safe and nurturing environment. The programs are age-appropriate, girl-driven, and reflect the interests and needs of today's girls.

Through Girl Scouting, girls *discover* as they explore their world, envision and prepare for a positive future, *connect* with others, understand and care about the needs of their community, become leaders advocating for themselves and others, and *take action* to make the world a better place.

How:

GSOFC reaches girls through a variety of pathways including: camps, events, short-term series groups, travel, and/or Troop participation. Our programs are flexible in order to accommodate the broad range of ages, interests and circumstances of the girls that we serve. The choice is vast, and new opportunities are developed as girls express interest. In Girl Scouts of Connecticut, there is a place for all girls who want to be Girl Scouts and act to improve themselves and the world around them.
