

Ramona Carlow is the Vice-President, Public Policy and Strategy, for AT&T. Her telecommunications expertise reaches back to the early 1990's to a position at the Department of Public Utility Control where she represented the agency on the legislative task force charged with opening the state's telecommunications market to competition. After several years advising the DPUC chairman on regulatory strategy and policy, Carlow worked as a telecommunications policy consultant for The Southern New England Telephone Company. She joined the company's regulatory group in 1997. In 2003, Carlow was appointed to the position of Vice President-Regulatory & External Affairs, responsible for regulatory, legislative, government, and external affairs activities in Connecticut. Carlow was named state President in January, 2007.

Her earlier legal experience includes serving as a law clerk at the Connecticut Supreme Court, and as an associate at the Hartford law firm of Robinson & Cole.
