



# SUMMER CAMP PROGRAMS IN THE SPOTLIGHT

## **ALL THINGS SCOTTISH: AN-SE-OX**

August 2-13

GRADES 1-3

FEE: \$325

Travel to the Scottish Highlands and play a game of golf. Listen to music and learn a Scottish folk song. Design your own tartan plaid and create your own family crest. Sample some fish and chips, scones, and shortbread and learn about Celtic art.

## **HORSE FUN: ASPETUCK**

August 2-6; August 9-13

GRADES 4-8

FEE: \$400

Spend time at the stables and learn about horses. This session includes grooming, feeding, tack and stable management. This one week session allows girls three opportunities to ride. Girls will be bussed to Mead Farm three days for riding lessons and stable time. A horseback riding questionnaire will be sent to all girls in this program to determine their riding ability. Mead Farm will accommodate beginner and intermediate riders.

## **CAMPER BLAST (DAY AND STAY): CANDLEWOOD DAY**

July 5-9; July 19-23; August 2-6

GRADES 1-3

FEE: \$295

Come with a buddy or on your own – either way you'll meet new friends! Together you'll swim, do arts and crafts projects, play games, and more. Monday – Thursday come for the day only, and then on Friday bring your gear for an overnight stay. Enjoy a campfire and other night activities with your group before nestling down for the night. Enjoy Saturday with your resident camp friends with parent pick up after dinner on Saturday evening.

## **WET AND WILD: CANDLEWOOD RESIDENT**

July 5-17; July 18-31; August 1-14

GRADES 4-6

FEE: \$750

Pack your sunscreen and bathing suit! If it's about water, if we have the equipment, and you have the skills, (and if the weather cooperates): you can do it. Your first few days will give you a taste of the many water activities at Candlewood. Then you will plan which water activities you wish to continue. Work to advance your canoe rating, paddle to an island for a lunch away from camp, try your hand at "Charles River Paddling," or have a floating lunch. Canoeing and kayaking? Snorkeling? Beach volleyball? You plan it, we'll help you do it. Girls must be comfortable in and about the water.

## **THE CHAT ROOM: CARLSON**

July 5-16

GRADES 6-8

FEE: \$325

Hieroglyphics, smoke signals, Morse code, and semaphore are different forms of communication. Are there other ways people communicate without words? Learn a little sign language and discover what our body language and facial expressions convey to others. Make jewelry and get a henna tattoo while learning how to be safe on the internet and while texting your friends.

### **A STITCH IN TIME: KATOYA**

July 19-30

GRADES 6-8

FEE: \$350

This session girls will learn how to use a sewing machine. You will create a patchwork pillow and a simple bag to carry your camp things. Learn to use cutting tools, how to read a pattern, and how to sew on a button. As a group, create a memory quilt of fun things you did at camp to display at the Katoya Program Center.

### **SURVIVOR: LAUREL DAY**

July 19-30

GRADES 1-8

FEE: \$325

Come to Camp Laurel for a series of personal and group challenges including splitting into tribes, wearing team colors, cooking over a fire, building a shelter, shooting at the archery range, and attempting an obstacle course with your tribe mates that will test your strength and wits. Get ready because the Laurel tribe has spoken.

### **CAMP CEO: LAUREL RESIDENT**

June 27-30

AGES 14 AND OLDER

FEE: \$245

Join in this exciting leadership program at Camp Laurel! You will have an amazing opportunity to *discover* how your interests, skills, and dreams can translate into you being a leader. Gain confidence in public speaking and become a positive role model for younger girls.
